Overview and Talking Points

ResearchHERS: Women Fighting Cancer empowers women to fundraise in support of women-led cancer research, but it's more than just a fundraising campaign – it's a movement. A sisterhood of purpose determined to sustain women-led cancer research and recognize the female trailblazers in the field. While the American Cancer Society has funded 49 researchers who have gone on to receive the Nobel Prize, none of them has been a woman...yet. By joining the ResearchHERS movement, you will help fuel the future of women-led cancer research.

As you spread the word about your involvement with the American Cancer Society as a ResearchHERS Ambassador, here are some talking points to assist you with questions you may receive. Of course, feel free to personalize your responses to fit your individual story and passion for this important cause.

ResearchHERS shines a light on the most exciting women-led cancer research projects in the field – and helps sustain the important work of these brilliant scientists.

Getting Started:

1. SET UP YOUR FACEBOOK FUNDRAISER:

When you combine Facebook with the American Cancer Society fundraising app, it's never been easier to invite your friends to donate to your cause. **Follow these directions to ensure that your fundraising is credited to your ResearchHERS: Women Fighting Cancer campaign.*

- Log in to your fundraising page dashboard.
- Connect your fundraiser to Facebook from the dashboard. Here's an easy [how-to video](#).
- Invite Facebook friends to donate and share your efforts.
 - ✓ Be sure to customize your Facebook fundraiser by updating the photo and copy
 - ✓ Continue to re-share or post every few days with new stats, stories, or photos to continue to drive donations.
 - ✓ Tag friends who donate with a shout out to keep your effort top of mind for followers.
- Track your progress.

2. CONNECT AND SHARE:

Connect with other ResearchHERS: Women Fighting Cancer Ambassadors on social media and share posts to join in the movement to champion women in science and fund lifesaving cancer research.

Social Media Best Practices:

- Instagram and LinkedIn users – include tags to @AmericanCancerSociety, your city (e.g., #Memphis) and the hash tags #ResearchHERS, #WomenInScience
- Instagram users – include a direct link (or [bitly link](#)) to your donation page in your Instagram bio. This is the only place to hyperlink a website on Instagram.
- Twitter users – update your profile to include a direct link (or [bitly link](#)) to your donation page.

Fundraising Ideas

Every dollar you raise helps the American Cancer Society save lives through groundbreaking cancer research led by women. Personalize your fundraising to include activities that will interest your networks. While your fundraising possibilities are endless, here are some ideas to get you started.

- **Personal**
 - Personalize your fundraising page on the ResearchHERS website with your personal story and photo and use your dashboard to send fundraising e-mails.

- Start your campaign by making a personal donation. Your friends, family, and business contacts will realize how important this cause is to you.
 - Share your personal story, in a letter to some of your personal contacts, describing why you are involved in this campaign and how their support would mean a lot to you.
 - Coordinate a fundraising effort tied to an activity you commit to doing if you hit a fundraising milestone. For example, maybe you will be up for wearing a lab coat for a day or temporarily dye your hair “scrubs green” when you hit your \$2,500 fundraising goal!
 - Use the Fundraising Flyer to post around your office and share with friends.
- **Use your fundraising dashboard to:**
 - Personalize your fundraising page on the ResearchHERS website with your personal story, a photograph, or a video.
 - Ask your friends and family for their support via email, Facebook, and Twitter.
 - Easily share the link to your personal page from your dashboard.
 - Enter check and cash donations, or make credit card donations.
 - Thank your donors and keep them updated on your progress.
 - Download the ACS Mobile FUNdraising App for Android or iPhone.
- **Social Media**
 - As you share your pictures and information about the ResearchHERS campaign, ask followers to donate to help you become the top fundraising Ambassador and support your mission to help save lives through groundbreaking research led by women.
 - Offer friends the chance to honor a loved one. For a certain donation (your choice), post a picture of someone whom your friend wants to honor or remember.
 - Provide updates on your fundraising progress through your social media networks, and always provide a link to your personal fundraising website.



Step 1: Find Your Event.

Visit [ACSResearchHERS.org](https://www.ACSResearchHERS.org) and search for your local event site by entering your event name or location in the “Find a Candidate or Campaign” search box.

Step 2: Sign Up.


At the very bottom of the page, click the **ACTIVATE** link to begin the registration process.

Step 4: Create Your Society Account.



Step 5: Get Involved!


Jump start your fundraising by donating to kick off your fundraising efforts!

American Cancer Society and Cancer Research Background

What research do we conduct?

- We conduct large-scale nationwide cancer prevention studies.
 - The insights we've gained from more than 2.5 million participants over more than half a century has informed cancer prevention and control programs, policies, and guidelines.
- We study the behavioral and psychosocial factors related to cancer.
 - These factors include things like stress, grief, and social support. Our Behavioral Research Center conducts original investigations in these areas, with the goal of reducing cancer risk and improve quality of life among survivors.
- We research tobacco control to impact policies worldwide.
 - Tobacco remains a leading cause of cancer worldwide, and our Economic and Health Policy Research program is dedicated to reducing the burden. With a focus on the economic and policy aspects of tobacco control, such as illicit trade and tobacco taxation, our researchers help educate governments and international organizations about the scope of tobacco's impact.
- We analyze the cancer landscape and work to improve it.
 - The Surveillance and Health Services Research program produces several widely cited reports (including our flagship *Cancer Facts & Figures*) on cancer incidence, mortality, early detection, and more. The team identifies critical gaps in cancer care and takes leadership in policy initiatives to address these gaps. The group also collaborates with scientists and organizations nationally and internationally.

What research do we fund?

- Translational Cancer Research
 - This program focuses on the interface between laboratory investigations and human cancer. Researchers explore the role of infectious diseases in cancer, the discovery and delivery of cancer drugs, the creation of animal models of cancer, and more.
- Molecular Genetics and Biochemistry of Cancer
 - This program focuses on genes involved in cancer and how alterations in those genes (mutations, deletions, and amplifications) play roles in the process. Researchers focus on new targets for prevention, detection, and treatment of cancer.
- Cancer Cell Biology and Metastasis
 - The primary goal of this program is to develop a better understanding of cancer cells so they can be more effectively controlled and eliminated. For example, scientists explore the mechanisms that regulate cancer cell growth, death, and movement to new sites.
- Clinical Cancer Research, Nutrition, and Immunology
 - The focus of this program is on therapies for cancer. The scope of the program includes basic, preclinical, clinical, and epidemiological investigations of immunotherapy, inflammatory responses, immunosurveillance, and innate and adaptive immune responses. Emphases include:
 - Development and application of new imaging and bioanalytical tools and techniques
 - How the exposome, nutrition, physical activity, and the environment impact cancer prevention, initiation, progression, and treatment

- Cancer Control and Prevention Research
 - The program focuses on the study of behaviors that can reduce cancer risk, improve early detection, or improve quality of life of patients and families. Special emphasis is placed on research focused on achieving health equity in disadvantaged groups.
- Health Professional Training in Cancer Control
 - This program provides grants to nurses, physicians, and social workers pursuing training in cancer prevention and control. One goal is to increase the number of health professionals with expertise in and a career commitment to cancer control.
