The Summer Health Experience (SHE) in Oncology is a 2-week virtual program that introduces high school juniors or seniors who identify as female to a wide range of cancer-related career experiences including research, clinical care, survivorship, and community engagement.

2022 Program Results

- More than 145 high school students who identify as female participated, nearly doubling participants year-over-year.
- Expanded the cohort sites from five to ten in 2022.
- Preliminary self-reported data shows a very diverse group of participants.

SHE IN ONCOLOGY AT A GLANCE

The American Cancer Society's Summer Healthcare Experience (SHE) in Oncology introduces female-identifying high school students, particularly those from backgrounds underrepresented within STEM fields, to a wide range of cancer related career experiences including research, clinical care, survivorship, and community engagement. Student participants benefit from development of leadership skills, exposure to role models and mentorship, and hands-on experiences meant to help them to develop their educational and career paths.


In 2022, ACS expanded the SHE in Oncology program from 5 to 10 premier cancer center sites, including The Ohio State University. Through support from corporate partners, as well as through funds raised via our ResearcHERS campaign, ACS provided each participating SHE site with \$20,000 to enact the program. This funding helped to ensure that there would be no cost to the participants or their families. Instead, funding directly supported the students' experiences - covering stipends, curated research kits, and their hands-on experiences.
